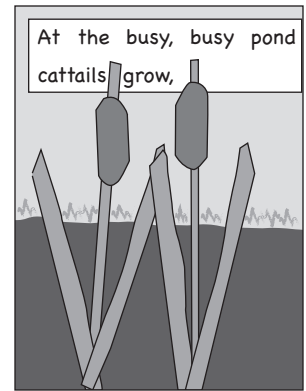


Cattails



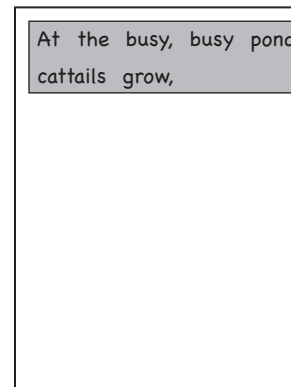
You Will Need For Each Child

Background	1 yellow rectangle	9"	x	12"
Text				
Water	1 royal blue rectangle	6"	x	9"
Leaves	2 green rectangles	1"	x	8"
Stems	2 green rectangles	1/4"	x	10"
Cattails	1 brown rectangle	1"	x	6"
scissors, glue, green crayon, pencil				

1.) Background: (yellow rectangle)



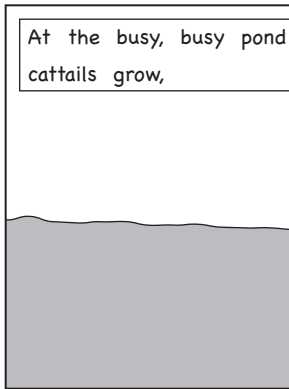
2.) Text:



- Place the yellow rectangle in a vertical position on the table
- Glue the text near the top of the yellow rectangle as shown

3.) Water:

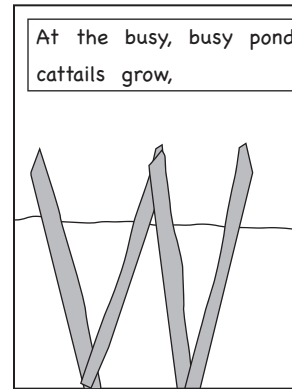
(royal blue rectangle)



- Hold the rectangle in a vertical position; tear off a narrow strip of paper along one long side
(See TLC Cuts for “tearing” instructions)
- Put a dot of glue in each corner; glue the water at the bottom of the yellow rectangle with the torn side up as shown

4.) Leaves:

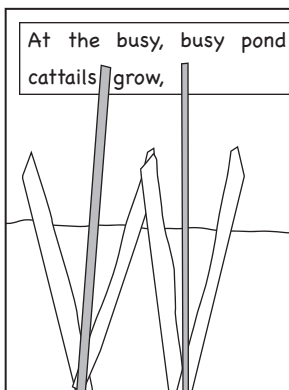
(two wider green rectangles)



- Hold each rectangle in a vertical position
- Cut off two big corners of each rectangle so the leaves will be pointed
- Cut each leaf lengthwise through the middle to make 2 thinner leaves
- Glue the leaves to the water as shown

5.) Stems:

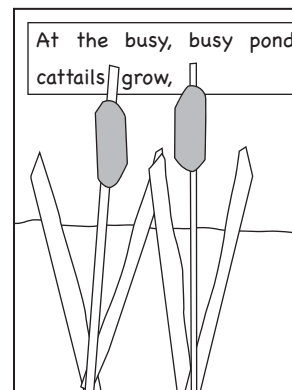
(two narrow green rectangles)



- Glue each stem between each of the two leaves as shown

6.) Cattails:

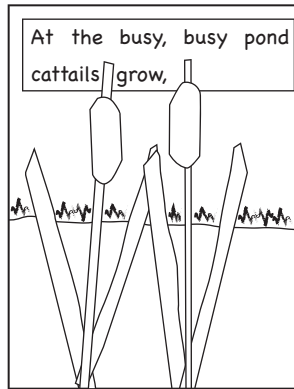
(brown rectangle)



- Fold the rectangle in half so you can cut two cattails at a time
- Cut an oval;
(See TLC Cuts for “oval cut” instructions)
if the pieces are still connected, cut apart on the fold line
- Glue the cattails to the stems as shown

7.) Details:

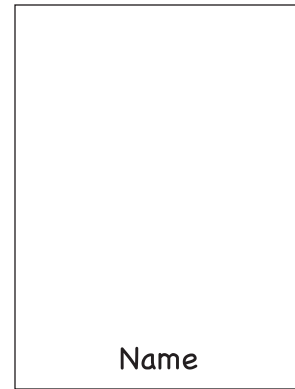
(green crayon)



- Draw the grass along the pond edge as shown

8.) Name:

(pencil)



- Turn your paper over and write your name at the bottom of the paper
